A Story of Hope: Trade School Transformation

In 2004, the trade school, which was meant to provide education and skilled training to youth and young adults living in poverty, was completely abandoned due to an ineffective board of directors and lack of leadership.

CAMO was asked to intervene and breathe life back into the school, so students who had not finished high school or did not have the means to go to college had an opportunity to learn and thrive in their communities.

Once key community leaders joined the board of directors, CAMO launched a campaign to acquire necessary equipment including carpentry tools and sewing machines.

Twenty years later, over 1,400 students receive training annually in areas including culinary arts, baking, bartending, barista, soap and candle making, graphic design, and more.

Joseph Ruiz, Trade School's executive director, emphasized that "CAMO...has been fundamental in guiding the vision of the Trade School towards a more accurate understanding of the region's needs and occupational demand."

Lucas Tabora, a barber who recently completed his training at the Trade School said, "After being unemployed, I started taking courses at the trade school, which allowed me to start my own business in my hometown!"

As more needs arise, CAMO has intervened to fill the gap. The most recent expansion project at the school serves as classrooms for welding, carpentry, nursing protocol training as well as CPR and first responder courses.

With the new training center, CAMO now has state-of-the-art facilities to expand its reach, training more health professionals, saving more lives, and providing affordable career paths for youth around Western Honduras.
